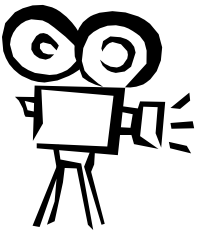

Taking Charge of Your Health

Impetigo in infants starts with a small blister containing yellowish or white pus surrounded by reddened skin. The blister breaks easily, leaving a small raw spot that may not crust over as with older children. Impetigo in infants is often found in moist areas, such as the diaper edge, groin or armpit.

Self-Care Tips

- Gently and frequently clean sores with antibacterial soap and water or hydrogen peroxide.
- Apply an antibiotic ointment using a Q-tip.
- Try not to cover the area with a Band-Aid.
- Wash your hands after cleaning wound.
- Do not share towels or bath water.
