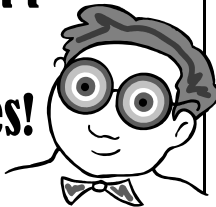

Q and A on Social Security

Each month, the Social Security Administration provides some common questions and answers that may apply to you or your family. If you have any questions you would like to be answered, call the Social Security Office at 1-800-772-1213.

Q My husband gets Social Security disability benefits because of severe disabilities. Last month, his leg was amputated due to his diabetes. Can we apply for an increase in his benefits since his condition has worsened?

A No. The Social Security benefit amount individuals receive is based on their work and earnings prior to their disability, not on the severity of their disabling condition. CHIP Rehab Funding

The City of Columbus Community Development Department is providing partially forgivable loans to support limited rehabilitation of owner-occupied homes. Loans may be used for roof replacement, heating and/or cooling systems replacement and upgrades of electrical systems when needed to support the new heating/cooling systems.

Up to \$10,000 can be borrowed and is determined by need and income levels (based on HUD guidelines). Eligible homes must be single-family, owner occupied, insured, located within the city limits of Columbus, and they must be permanent units—homes being purchased on contract are not eligible and most mobile homes are not eligible.
